- The 2014 Northern Lecture Program is being finalised, and we have confirmed speakers on topics as diverse as ancient Aboriginal archaeology, the vaccination debate, viticulture and climate change, current advances in psychiatry, researching ocean currents in the Southern Oceans and Antarctica using seals to carry measuring instrumentation, and an exploration of the Royal Society's own Library and Archives. - We are planning to hold three forums for 2014, one on the current management of bowel cancer, at which an oncologist, a gastroenterologist, and a specialist surgeon will speak. Further forums on education and science are still at the planning stage.
- A recent field trip to the Human Interface Technology Laboratory (HITLab) at the Newnham campus of UTas by eight members provided a fascinating insight into innovative ways humans can interact with computers. Several members enjoyed standing in front of a screen and using gestures to design a molecule using atoms from a displayed list. Others practised using a rehabilitation/physiotherapy computer model which assessed their ability to follow the movements shown on the screen by tracking how well they moved their arms and legs in response to the instructions. Members appreciated the time Professor Henry Duh and his staff gave to inform us of their activities and research
