## THE ROYAL SOCIETY OF TASMANIA

The object of the Society is *The Advancement of Knowledge*. This object is achieved by programmes of lectures, panel discussions, symposia and excursions, by publications and by the use of the library of the Society. Members come from many walks of life and have a variety of interests.

## **HISTORY OF THE SOCIETY**

The Royal Society of Tasmania is the oldest scientific society in Australia and New Zealand, and is the oldest Royal Society outside Britain. The Society was founded in 1843 by Sir John Eardley-Wilmot. Initially called "The Botanical and Horticultural Society of Van Diemen's Land", the name was changed to the "Royal Society of Van Diemen's Land for Horticulture, Botany and the Advancement of Science" when Sir John Eardley-Wilmot negotiated Queen Victoria's patronage in 1844. In 1911 the name was changed to "The Royal Society of Tasmania". A branch was formed in Launceston in 1853. Both the current Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens and the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery were established by the initial efforts of members of the Society.
