The Royal Society of Tasmania was founded in 1843 and is the oldest Royal Society outside Britain. The Society established botanical gardens and a museum that were fore-runners of the Royal Tasmanian Botanical Gardens and the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery. The modern goal of the Society is the "advancement of knowledge". This goal is achieved by:

- offering a program of public lectures
- publishing a journal (the *Papers and Proceedings of the Royal Society of Tasmania*) and books
- sponsoring educational events
- making its Library and Art Collections available for research, and
- offering medals and awards to outstanding scholars.

Members come from many walks of life and have a variety of interests.

The Society's Office is in TMAG, Davey Street, Hobart. The RST Art Collection is held in TMAG and the RST Library Collections are held in the Morris Miller Library at UTAS. A branch of the RST was established in Launceston in 1853 and operates from the QVMAG.
